Covid 19 Safety

Florida Veterinary Behavior Service is beginning to see in-office appointments again.
Our staff is continuing to follow CDC Guidelines for social distancing and disinfecting.

In order for your pet to be seen in-office, we ask that you comply with the following guidelines:

- **Only 1 pet parent allowed in the exam room.**
If an additional pet parent wants to be present, they can call in and be placed on speaker phone or they can video conference with us during the appointment.
- **All pet parents must wear a mask.**
- **When you arrive call or text us at 561-795-9398.**
A team member will come near your car and walk you directly to the exam room.

We ask for your patience in between appointments as we disinfect all surfaces.

Your pet's appointment can still be via telehealth, as long as it is not an annual exam.

If your pet is due for an annual exam and you are concerned about coming in-office, we can split the appointment in to two parts:

- Part 1 - Physical Exam
This appointment will last approximately 20 minutes. We will meet you outside and bring your pet inside to perform a physical exam and any recommended labwork.
- Part 2 - Assessment via telehealth
You and your pet go home and video conference with the doctor on the same day.
